We organized SDG week from 17 May'22 until 20 May'22. We planned a series of events organized by our SDG goalkeepers, to bring awareness and enthusiasm about the SDGs.

We believe that learning about these SDGs will help students in developing insights into critical issues around the world, such as gender equality, no hunger, quality education, etc.

During this SDG week, we carried out the following activities:

1. SDG assembly:

SDG goalkeepers hosted the SDG-themed assembly and advocated the SDGs. They gave a brief introduction about all 17 SDGs and then explained how we integrate these SDGs into our daily learning via theme-based assemblies, celebrating International women's day, and global perspective classes.

At the end of the assembly, SDG week plan was shared and instructions about the competitions were given to all students.



2. Car Free Day:

We asked students in townsite 1 to walk to school, if possible and to our delight, many students supported the campaign and came to school walking. They also shared their photos with slogans such as “I support car-free day”

3. English essay competition:

Students were given the task to write an essay about gender equality.

For JHS the topic was : *Gender equality means providing equal opportunities to both men and women in political, economic, education, and health aspects.*

6. SDG quiz:

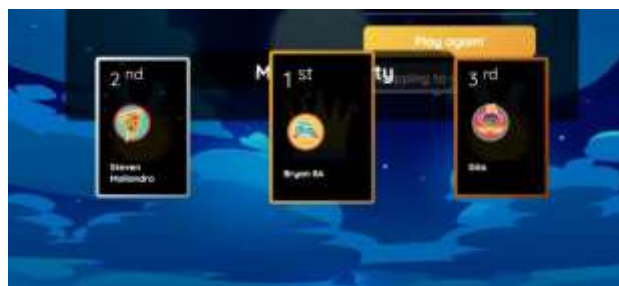
All JHS students participated in the online quiz about SDG. Quiz/Presentation about SDGs. Winners were awarded certificates.

3rd: Gita Dearios Ompusunggu Grade 9 A

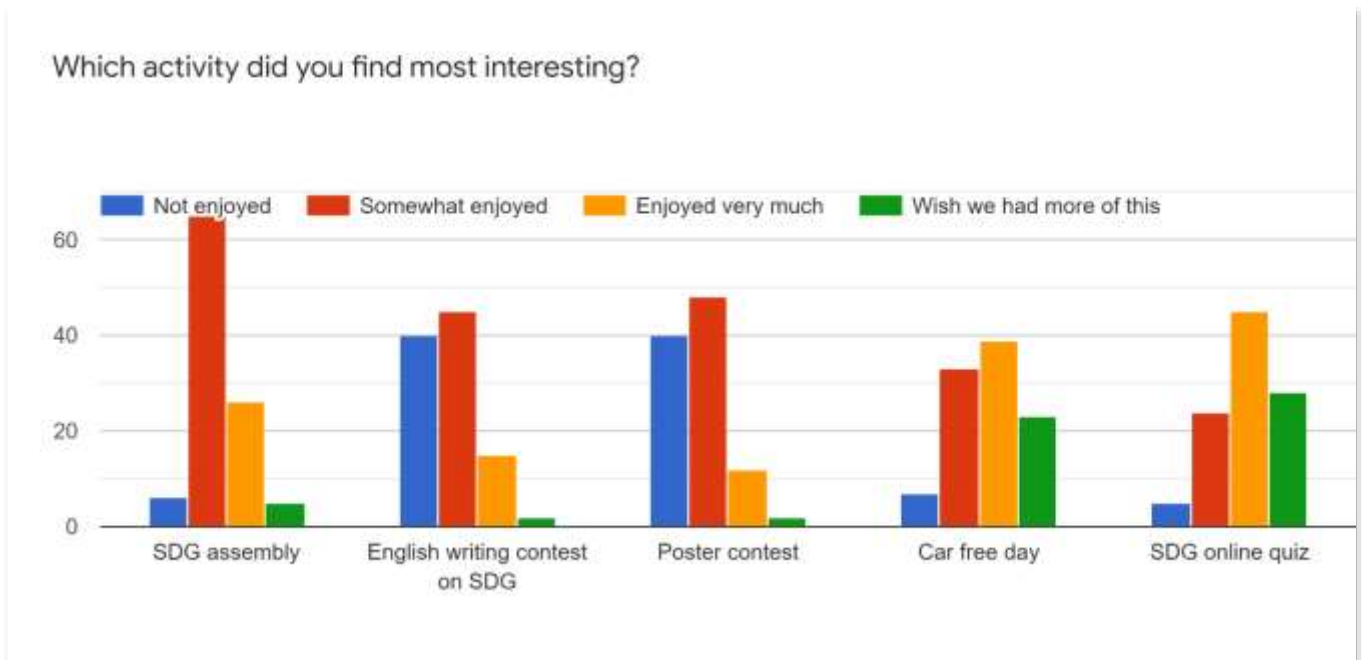


7. Reflection of the SDG week:

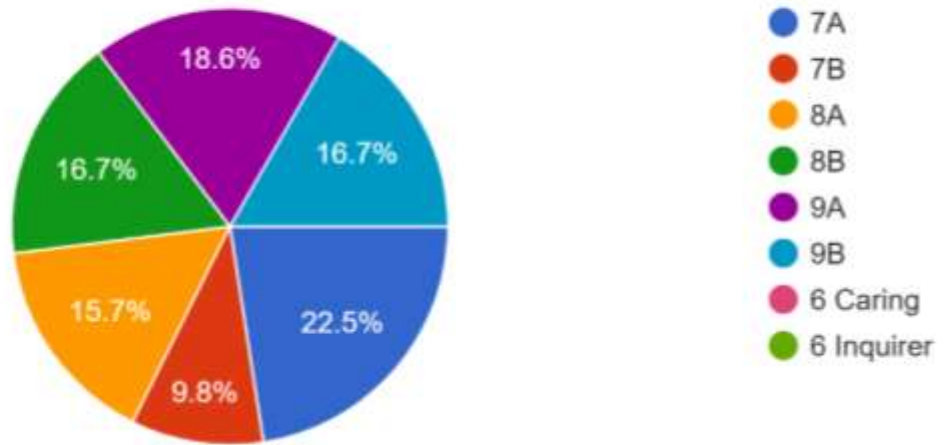


Students reflected on how we did and what can we do to make it better next time?
